| The Greenwich Hotel

I 377 Greenwich Street "I don't stay in hotels, since I live in New York, but this is where I send all my out-of-town friends. My producing partner, Bob De Niro, recently opened the place. It's gorgeous; each of the 88 rooms is decorated differently. After checking in, take a walk through the neighborhood to get a true feel for downtown New York. Walk to the West Side Highway for a great view of the Hudson River, and you'll realize Manhattan is, in fact, an island."

Now that you've worked up an appetite, grab a bite to eat at this hot spot. The chicken and mashed potatoes are delicious—perfect comfort food for a cool fall evening. The wine list includes over 300 bottles."

"Take a break for light fare right inside Barneys. During the week it's packed with fashion-industry and business executives, but on weekends it's relatively laid-back. One of my favorite dishes is the grilled asparagus with melted Parmesan cheese and aged balsamic vinegar."





"They sell jewelry you can't live without. I buy resin bracelets and handmade cuffs in eye-popping colors."


